Directions to Brooksvale Park, Hamden:

Via Merritt Parkway (Rt. 15) Northbound:

Take Route 15 North to Exit 61 (Whitney Avenue - Hamden)
At the end of the ramp, take a RIGHT onto Whitney Avenue.
Follow Whitney Avenue for approximately 4.6 miles.
Take a LEFT onto Brooksvale Avenue (This is directly across from
Contrassegno Restaurant.) Follow Brooksvale Avenue for .8 miles.
Take a LEFT into the park entrance

Via Merritt Parkway (Rt. 15) Southbound:

Take Route 15 South to Exit 62 (Whitney Avenue - Hamden)
At the end of the ramp, take a RIGHT onto Whitney Avenue.
Follow Whitney Avenue for approximately 4.6 miles.
Take a LEFT onto Brooksvale Avenue (This is directly across from
Contrassegno Restaurant.) Follow Brooksvale Avenue for .8 miles.
Take a LEFT into the park entrance.

Via I-91 North or Southbound:

Take I-91 North or South to Exit 10 (Route 40 Connector).
Stay on the Route 40 Connector to the very end.
At the light at the end of the ramp, take a RIGHT onto Whitney
Avenue. Follow Whitney Avenue for approximately 3 miles.
Take a LEFT onto Brooksvale Avenue (This is directly across from
Contrassegno Restaurant.) Follow Brooksvale Avenue for .8 miles.
Take a LEFT into the park entrance.

What is Spinal Muscular Atrophy?

SMA is the leading genetic killer of children under the age of two.

SMA is a group of inherited and often fatal diseases that destroy the nerves that command voluntary muscle movement, such as crawling, walking, head and neck control, and even swallowing and breathing.

One in 40 people is a carrier and one in 6,000 babies are born afflicted with SMA.

Currently, there is no cure for Spinal Muscular Atrophy.
